
Dear Friend:

The YMCA of Greater Boston is committed to helping children develop their full potential to achieve a bright and successful future and to grow up in a community free from violence and neglect.

Whether they are preschoolers in our early childhood education programs or youth participating in out-of-school time activities, the YMCA is helping Greater Boston children develop the skills and core values necessary to succeed in school and beyond.

We support the academic success of youth in our programs by helping young children enter kindergarten ready to learn through quality early education and providing academic support to older children by aligning YMCA activities with the Massachusetts Curriculum Framework for Learning. All YMCA after school programs support in-school learning.

The YMCA is also committed to helping children grow up free from the impact of neglect, violence and abuse by promoting and upholding the highest standards in our programs for child safety and providing parent education so families can do the same at home. In 2009, we joined with the Massachusetts Children's Trust Fund to engage our parents on the important issue of the personal safety of children. In 2009, we also expanded and strengthened our efforts to stem youth violence in Boston through partnerships with community organizations and law enforcement that increased youth programming during the critical evening, weekend and summer hours.

In total more than 35,000 children realized their potential to succeed in 2009 through our licensed early education after school programs and through hundreds of aquatics, youth sports and health and wellness programs.

As the largest provider of preventative health care in Massachusetts, the YMCA is positively addressing the negative effects of chronic disease—the number one killer in America. For nearly 160 years, the YMCA has strongly advocated the importance of moderate physical activity and good nutrition for good health.

Our YMCAs work to create a positive, supportive community that empowers people to succeed and reach their personal best. Whether it is taking that first step on a treadmill or continuing physical therapy after knee surgery, the YMCA offers the equipment, trained personnel and friendly atmosphere that contribute to personal success.

To address prevalent health issues facing the city, including asthma, diabetes and obesity, we partnered with hospitals and community health centers to offer free programs and education to enable sufferers to take charge of their health.

One of the most exciting discoveries in wellness is new evidence that proves that moderate exercise has a very positive impact on reducing the reoccurrence of some cancers. Through a new partnership with the Lance Armstrong Foundation, the YMCA offers LiveSTRONG, a 12-week free fitness program for cancer survivors. In 2009, 55 cancer survivors took part in specialty, medically-based wellness programs that were designed through hospital research to specifically meet their needs.

“Socially the program gave me an opportunity to be with other cancer survivors who were striving to maintain their health and image. We all shared a common goal, to stay healthy and take control of our bodies instead of the cancer taking control of us. The YMCA instructors’ outlook on life, with exercise as a part of it, was contagious. I always looked forward to feeling and absorbing their positive outlooks and energy.”

At the YMCA of Greater Boston we believe we have a responsibility to give back to the communities we serve.

For nearly 160 years, the YMCA of Greater Boston has remained steadfast in our mission to strengthen spirit, mind and body for all. We believe that every person in our community should feel welcomed, valued, and respected. We partner with our neighbors to address social issues, advance the quality of life for individuals and families and stabilize Greater Boston's neighborhoods.

Throughout Greater Boston we engage more than 200 organizations to address the critical challenges facing communities and develop collective solutions towards positive change. Annually, we encourage civic engagement and public service by providing more than 1,000 youth and adults with volunteer opportunities. Over 200 community and business leaders serve as members of our local YMCA advisory boards helping to identify the needs of their community and guide the types of programs and services offered locally.

Our commitment to social responsibility resulted in the YMCA's decision to stay in Logan Square and invest \$9 million in the expansion and revitalization of our 1902 Hyde Park YMCA. While many institutions chose not to move forward with major capital plans in 2009, the YMCA did not delay because we knew that the need for quality youth programs and help leading healthier and more active lives was increasing in Hyde Park. Hyde Park has the fastest growing youth population in the city, and starting in the fall of 2010 our new facility will be ready to help Hyde Park youth develop, grow and thrive.

And this commitment extends beyond our buildings to making our programs affordable and accessible to all. We mobilize a team of volunteers each year to raise funds to support YMCA programs and services in their community. In 2009, our YMCAs provided over \$3 million in direct scholarships and services to individuals and families throughout Greater Boston thanks in part to local fundraising efforts.
